

## Justin Kirk Jones

Justin Kirk Jones, 18 years old, ended his journey with cancer on June 5, 2009 at his home in Edmonds, WA. Born July 7, 1990 in Seattle to Kirk Jones and Connie (Higbee) Jones, he was diagnosed with leukemia at 16 months old. He persevered through numerous complications and a relapse in 1998. During this time, he was a member of St. Thomas Catholic Parish in Tukwila, and attended school at the Westside School, Riverton Heights Elementary, and Hilltop Elementary in the Highline School District. He enjoyed camping with his family and trips through the Western United States and Canada.

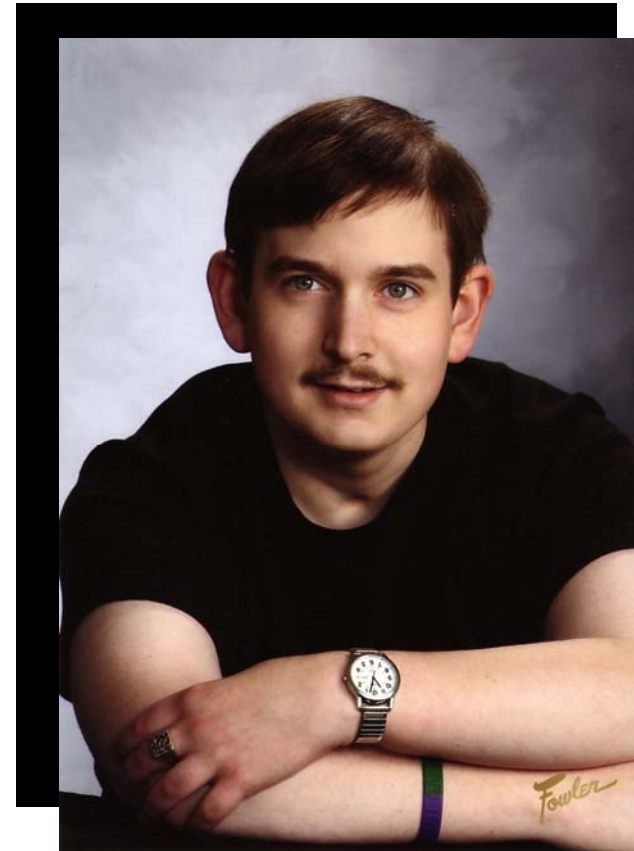
After the death of his mother, he moved to Edmonds where he attended College Place Middle School and was a 2009 graduate of Edmonds Woodway High School. Diagnosed with a brain tumor in 2007, Justin forged ahead with surgeries and difficult treatment. He continued in school, was studying in a nursing assistant program at Sno-Isle Tech, and volunteered at the Puget Sound Blood Center. During this time, he took several long road trips to visit family and to see the country. He attended Edmonds United Methodist Church.

Justin was preceded in death by his mother Connie Jones, his grandfather Ed Jones, and grandmother Pat Higbee.
